Overview of the National School Nutrition

Programme

 On 23 March 2020, the SA President Mr Cyril Ramaphosa announced a National Lockdown starting midnight of 26 March 2020 to curb the spread of the Coronavirus

Impact on the National School Nutrition Programme (NSNP):

- Schools were closed thus the NSNP could not be implemented
- The NSNP is a key government Programme rolled out by the Department of Basic Education (DBE) aimed at providing daily nutritious meals to over 9.5 million learners in 21 000 schools
- Schools are classified in quintile system > allocated all government schools into one of five categories, with quintile 1 schools designating the poorest institutions while quintile 5 denoted the least poor public schools
- The NSNP mandate focus on mostly poorest schools which are mainly quintile 1 -3 primary, secondary, and special schools but also target learners in quintile 4-5 schools





NSNP Implementation

- NSNP is government funded: 20/21 financial year R7.7 billion National Treasury review the budget annually
- Conditional Grant Framework provide guidelines to implement the programme on all levels(National, Provincial, Districts and Schools)

Key areas:

- Cooked nutritional meal is served consisting of a protein, starch and vegetable or fruit dishes
- Nutrition Education (hygiene practices and Deworming Programme)
- Food gardens and procurement of fresh produce from small-scale farmers

Implementation:

- Dept of Basic Education as well as all 9 provinces has a NSNP team to implement the programme
- Monitoring system call Monitoring , Report and Response (MRR) is in place that rate the effective implementation of the NSNP with KPI "Nutritious meals is served on time"
- Job creating opportunities > 56 000 Volunteer Food Handlers that prepare and cook the meals as well as Service providers (SMEs)





COVID-19 Impact on NSNP

April to May 2020: No Schooling

- The DBE supported the Department of Social Development (DSD) applying for Disaster Relief Funds to provide food parcels to households. The food parcel content was determined DoH, DSD and DBE
- Social partners were requested to support with donations e.g. food or funding to Community Nutrition Centers in support of DSD





DBE Response to COVID-19

- 8 June 2020: The reopening of schools > phased approach beginning with grades 7-12 (risk adjusted school calendar)
- 24 August 2020- All learners return to Schools
- DBE developed COVID-19 Schools Protocols and DoH Guidelines

(strict adherence 1.5 m social distancing, masks and sanitized on entering school grounds)

- Schools implemented rotational timetables and some learners can study from home on request that must be approved
- The following NSNP Conditional Grant Framework changes were made:
- Provinces submitted amended business plans
- Feeding days were adjusted to an amended school calendar
- Menus to be adjusted to include food parcels for far-flung schools
- To respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, provinces may use Grant funds for addititional sanitisation in food preparation and distribution areas and the provision of personal protective equipment (PPEs) for Volunteer Food Handlers (VFHs)
- Training on COVID safety measures for VFHs

Gauteng High Court Judgement: Equal Education and Others versus the Minister of Basic Education

 17 July 2020 (structural interdict) judgement against Minister and 8 MECs on breach of their constitutional and statutory duty to ensure that the National School Nutrition Programme [NSNP] provides a daily meal to all qualifying learners whether they are attending school or studying away from school as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic





Court case continue...

DBE Actions required:

Three weekly reports submitted to the Gauteng High Court on:

- Statistics on learners receiving daily meals
- Meals distribution cooked meals, collection of cooked meals and food parcels
- Update on approved provincial amended business plans

Challenges:

- Not all learners collect meals on days not attending school >
- Food wastage
- Scholar transport access as per normal routes and schedules not adjusted to take learners home after collecting meals
- Schools not reporting accurately
- Paper-based reporting

Way Forward:

 Department seeking technology based daily school reporting mechanism on learners receiving meals
